

Warren B. Powell is a professor in the Department of Operations Research and Financial Engineering at Princeton University, where he has taught since 1981. He is the founder and director of the laboratory for Computational Stochastic Optimization and Learning (CASTLE Labs), which spans contributions to models and algorithms in stochastic optimization, with applications to energy systems, transportation systems, and optimal learning in materials science. His work spans different communities in stochastic optimization within operations research and computer science. He is the author of *Approximate Dynamic Programming: Solving the Curses of Dimensionality* (which bridges computer science and operations research) and is a co-author (with Ilya Ryzhov) of *Optimal Learning* (both published by Wiley).
